News from your Wayne County Extension Office

Purdue Extension, Wayne County Health & Human Sciences "Extension Does"

A new year is an opportunity to look forward, set goals, and plan for a successful year ahead. However, it is also a time for reflection and consideration of the past 365 days. The Purdue Extension system had an impressive 2016 and Purdue Extension Wayne County was a contributor to this overall success.

As is typical in most counties, the county Extension Office tends to be most associated with the county 4-H program. Wayne County has a booming 4-H program that we are very proud to grow and manage. Indiana's adoption of the "4-H Grows Here" slogan is certainly applicable in Wayne County! Our 4-H youth membership, adult volunteers, and 4-H families are responsible for hundreds of volunteer hours in Wayne County. In addition, the Purdue Extension Wayne County staff offers several different programs to all youth in Wayne County including "Chick It Out" Chicken Embryology, National Youth Science Day programs, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) programs, and programs related to natural resources.

4-H is no doubt our largest Extension sponsored program in Wayne County. However, the Purdue Extension Wayne County staff also offers countless programs and information related to topics surrounding agriculture and natural resources and health and human sciences. Most of the services provided by the Purdue Extension Wayne County Office are free and available to all residents of the county. The impact of education provided that is related to these programming areas is far reaching, impactful, and a huge value for county taxpayers.

During 2016, Jonathan Ferris, Purdue Extension Wayne County Agriculture & Natural Resources/4-H Youth Development Educator and County Extension Director, conducted 76 separate program opportunities that reached nearly 2,170 people. These educational sessions ranged from pond clinics to wild game processing. In addition to his programs, Jonathan provided 410 individual consultations in Wayne County. Jonathan's programming efforts are often related to expanding agriculture related opportunities, fostering responsible land use, and conserving resources. Jonathan is available for consultations and is willing to conduct home visits to help county residents troubleshoot issues or answer questions that they may have related to fields, forests, ponds, lawns, gardens, etc. Jonathan also offers a soil sampling service for Wayne County residents. Residents with soil concerns can bring in dry soil and for a \$15.00 fee, the soil is sent to the University of Kentucky for analysis. The analysis and recommendations for improving soil quality is then provided for the land owner.

During 2016, Alicia Criswell, Purdue Extension Wayne County Health & Human Sciences/4-H Youth Development Educator, conducted 113 separate program opportunities that reached nearly 1,900 people. These educational sessions ranged from childcare provider trainings to home preservation/canning workshops. In addition to her programs, Alicia provided approximately 620 individual consultations in Wayne County. Alicia's programming efforts are often related to enhancing positive life skills, promoting healthy living, and strengthening families. Alicia is available for consultations to help county residents troubleshoot issues or answer questions they may have related to food safety, parenting, improving health and/or diet, and financial management. Alicia also works with the Indiana Department of Health to offer the "Cribs for Kids" program, which is designed to reduce the instance of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome in Wayne County. Caregivers of infants and/or expecting parents who are without a safe and independent environment for their baby to sleep receive a free pack 'n play and infant survival kit after participating in a safe sleep training.

Statewide, Purdue Extension aided in the swift action to help combat an outbreak of avian influenza in South Indiana in 2016. Health and Human Sciences saw the adoption and implementation of two needed and impactful programs for parents. Indiana 4-H began "Spark" clubs as a way to introduce non-traditional youth to the 4-H program. Through these initiatives, thousands of individuals, families, and communities were served.

Obviously, Purdue Extension continues to improve lives and livelihoods throughout Indiana. Purdue Extension in Wayne County is thriving and we invite you to be a part of what "Extension Does."
