The Trans-Pacific Partnership would grow Indiana jobs

Indiana is the most manufacturing-intensive state in the nation. That is a fancy way of saying Indiana has more jobs dependent on manufacturing than any other state. If one adds the value of our manufactured exports to the value of our agricultural exports, then divides this sum by our population, Indiana is the most export-dependent state per capita (Source: David Williams Russell, Chairman - International Law, Harrison & Moberly LLP). Therefore, Indiana benefits from free trade agreements (FTAs), such as the proposed Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) and the Trans-Atlantic Trade & Investment Partnership (T-TIP).

President-Elect Trump has threatened to revise and, in some cases, rescind existing FTAs. It made for effective campaign rhetoric necessary to get elected, to tout nostalgic notions of bringing back to America low-skilled jobs (that are actually gone for good, with only 12% due to trade and 88% due to automation (Source: Center for Business & Economic Research, Ball State University)). Let's hope that, once in office, President Trump will do the right thing for our manufacturers and farmers by enhancing free, though fair, trade. Similarly, President Lyndon Johnson excluded voting rights from the Civil Rights Act of 1964, in order to win the election. Then LBJ did the right thing with the Voting Rights Act of 1965.

When he was my Congressman, Vice President-Elect Pence was a strong advocate of free, though fair, trade and its resultant jobs. As Governor, Pence restored some aspects of export promotion to the Indiana Economic Development Corporation (IEDC). Therefore, we can only hope Vice President Pence will influence President Trump to do the right thing by our nation's manufacturers and farmers. We also hope that Governor-Elect Holcomb will continue to restore all aspects of export promotion to the IEDC.

The Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP) would allow for free trade among 12 Pacific Rim nations. In addition to providing more exporting opportunities for American manufacturers and farmers, the TPP will also act as an economic counterweight to China. Several of these Pacific Rim nations have already signed FTAs with the US over the past 20 years. Having done business with almost all of these countries, I can attest first-hand to the growth of exports there, once the FTAs were implemented. Despite a currently higher than normal US Dollar, the value of US exports to the 20 countries with whom we already have FTAs outweighs the value of our imports from these 20 countries (by \$65 billion in 2015 and by \$119 billion in 2014)(Source: Andrew Reinke, President, Foreign Targets, Inc.). TPP countries purchase 55% of Indiana's exports (\$20.8 billion) and almost 300,000 Indiana jobs are supported by trade with TPP countries Source: US Department of Commerce).

US Senator-Elect Todd Young is among four current members of the US House of Representatives who comprise the Congressional T-TIP Caucus. He recognized early-on the benefits of free trade with the European Union to grow Indiana jobs. Therefore, he should also be a natural ally for passage of TPP.

Between now and Christmas, the lame-duck session of Congress will take place. Please contact retiring Senator Dan Coats, Senator Joe Donnelly, and your US Representative, to urge passage of the Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), preferably during the lame-duck session. This will grow more Indiana jobs.
