The Town of Centerville is a combined sewer overflow (CSO) community; a combined sewer accepts both wastewater and stormwater to be treated by the wastewater plant.

During a substantial rainfall event the combined sewers are not able to handle and treat the additional flow causing untreated flow to be released from the system at the combined sewer overflow discharge point. The discharge point is located at Noland's Fork Creek, south of the abandoned railway bridge. A CSO event occurred on **January 12, 2017** that requires residents to take caution that no swimming or drinking of the water downstream from the discharge point occurs for several days after this CSO event.

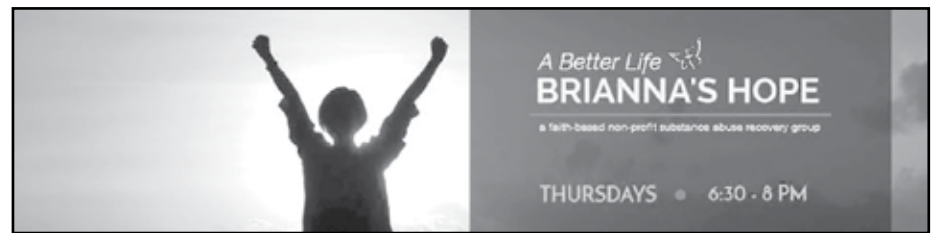
The Western Wayne Food Pantry will be open this Saturday, January 21 promptly at 9:00 a.m. and will close just as promptly at 10:30 a.m. Please be punctual for this service. Also, remember we ask that you pick up your own supplies. We are aware of a few instances where the party cannot come because of illness. We try to accommodate these situations. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

As always, we are continually in need of items to dispense, and monies to provide those items. Should you need ideas of what to purchase for donating, a list can be provided for you. Whatever you might purchase for your own larder would be appropriate for this supply collection. We have found that regular sized items are much preferred over large economy sized items as most of our participants are one and two member households. One item that is always needed is toilet tissue. Monetary gifts are not used to purchase this item, as well as toiletries, etc.

If you aren't busy on Tuesday afternoons about 3:00, or Thursday evenings about 6:00, your help is appreciated for processing these items. Each participant receives 2 sacks of groceries and they must be sacked and prepared for dispensing. Saturday folks are needed to carry these 2 sacks to the participants vehicle, too.

The Clothes Closet will also be open at 9 to 11:30 for those who might need clothing items that are gently used. There have been some restrictions placed on these supplies as some have abused the service. We hope you will cooperate by not abusing these free items of clothing. Should you have items to donate, please call ahead to the church office 478-5123 to assure that they will reach the "Closet".

Please remember that NO government funds are received for this service, a true indication of what "the people" can do for each other when we work together.
